FRFR (A) CERTAIN LOTS OF GROUND, together with all the buildings and improvements thereon, and all the rights, ways, privileges, servitudes, accoutreances and advantages therunto belonging or in anywise appertaining, situated in the City of New Orleans, in the Third District thereof, in Square No. 427, bounded by St. Claude Avenue, Eganria, Marais and Andry Streets; and, according to a survey by Kroll E. Kelly, Surveyor, dated November 11, 1797, a copy of which is attached to an act of mortgage passed before James A. Canlaskey on November 23, 1796, the said lots are designated by the letters, B, C, D and E, adjoin each other and measure as follows:

LOTS R, C AND D measure each 17 feet front on St. Claude Avenue, same width in the rear, by a depth between equal and parallel lines of 112 feet; Lot B is closest to and commences at a distance of 32 feet from the corner of St. Claude Avenue and Andry Street. LOT E adjoins lot D and measures 60 1/2 feet front on St. Claude Avenue, with a width in the rear of 60 1/2 feet (60 1/2 feet actual), with a depth of 112 feet. The improvements thereon bear the following description:
